Impact Grades 9-12 June 10-15 (Sun-Fri)

This is a week of swimming, hiking, crafts, and games dedicated to high school youth who want to impact their faith and character. You will experience all that camp has to offer as you draw closer to God and focus on God's call in your life. Opt for **Classic**, **M.A.D.** or **Adventure** on your registration form.

Epicerter Grades 6-8 June 17-22 (Sun-Fri)

This week is designed for middle school aged campers and will strengthen their relationship with God. Come experience the "epicerter" of your faith, and leave as a newly recharged person in the family of God. Opt for **Classic**, **M.A.D.** or **Adventure** on your registration form.

First Timers Grades 2-4 June 27-30 (Wed-Sat) July 1-3 (Sun-Tues)

Designed especially for newer campers or as a beginning experience, this week is perfect for younger campers. You experience camp over a shorter period of time, but still have the opportunity to be part of all that camp has to offer.

You & Me Camp Ages 6 & up June 27-30 (Wed-Sat) July 1-3 (Sun-Tues)

You & Me Camp offers grandparents, aunts, uncles, or special adults, and children to stay together in the conference center. You will participate in traditional camp activities, as well as have time on your own to develop a special bond.



Ignition Grades 4-6 July 8-13 (Sun-Fri)

A great opportunity for elementary age campers to experience all that Geneva Center has to offer without the intensity of the wilderness or off site experiences. You will stay in cabins and eat meals in the dining hall.

Combo Camp Grades 7-12 July 15-20 (Sun-Fri)

Combo Camp is a different experience that combines programs and ages. This week will forge lasting relationships, and will be a great opportunity to energize your faith before school. Opt for **Classic**, **M.A.D.** or **Adventure** on your registration form.

General Camp Information

Meals: Most meals will be served in the Dining Room. Adventure camps will cook some of their meals over an open fire with the supervision of the Geneva Center staff. Be sure to indicate any special dietary needs on your registration form.

Mail, Phones, Electronic Devices: Please tell your parents & friends to send email to: camp@genevacenter.org. No attachments or pictures will be printed. Make sure that the camper's name in the subject line. Sorry, we do not allow cell phones or other electronic devices to be brought to camp. If you bring one, we will hold it for you in the office until the end of camp. This is a time of group building and connecting with God and we believe this can be done much more effectively without those outside distractions. Please be assured, we will contact you if there is ever any reason to do so.

Arrival: Registration for most camps will take place at the Lakeview Pavilion. There will be signs leading you to the appropriate location. Registration begins at 3:00 pm (Eastern Time) on the first day of camp, unless otherwise communicated in publicity for your event.

Departure: Campers may be picked up at 3:00 pm (Eastern Time) on the last day of camp, unless otherwise communicated in publicity for your event. Please plan your travel time to be on time, but not overly early.

Staff: Geneva Center takes very seriously the important role that our summer staff plays in the camp program. We strive to put in place highly qualified and motivated staff and volunteers who desire to make a difference in the lives of our campers. All summer staff will go through an intensive training to prepare them to meet the needs of our campers.

Lost and Found: Please mark all of your belongings with your name for easy identification. All remaining items will be donated to local charities in September.

Insurance: Geneva Center provides initial emergency and first aid services as required. Insurance coverage is the responsibility of the camper's parent or guardian.

Camperships: Our desire is that finances are not a factor in deciding if you can attend camp. With that in mind, we do have a limited number of "camperships" available. These camperships are made **possible through generous individuals and churches**. If you need financial assistance or want to contribute to the campership fund, please contact us for information.
